Progress Report on Strategic Priorities

Advice Sought

Members are invited to note the progress of implementation of the strategic priorities of the Hospital Authority (**HA**) in the third quarter of 2023 (**3Q23**), as set out in this paper, for regular reporting to the HA Board (**HAB**).

Background

- 2. HA delivers a comprehensive range of subsidised healthcare services ranging from acute, convalescence and rehabilitation, through to community care. The Annual Plan outlines the major programmes and activities that HA will focus on for the next 12 months. In the Annual Plan 2023-24, four strategic goals and 22 strategies are being implemented by HA through the corresponding programme targets. They are developed in accordance with the HA Strategic Plan 2022-2027. The strategic goals, which set out what HA wants to achieve, are as follows:
 - Provide Smart Care
 - **♦** Develop Smart Hospitals
 - ◆ Nurture Smart Workforce
 - ◆ Enhance Service Supply
- 3. HA's service priorities for 2023-24 as set out in the HA Annual Plan for the year was approved by the Board at the Open Board Meeting held on 23 March 2023¹.

Programme Targets Planned for Completion in 3Q23

4. There are a total of 11 programme targets planned for completion in 3Q23 (i.e. those covered in this report). Five programmes are reported under corporate plans; and six programmes are reported under cluster plans. All programme targets were achieved as scheduled. Details are provided in the **Annex**.

HA is taking steady strides in service development and enhancements through increased utilisation of healthcare technology while staying vigilant on the local situation of infectious diseases including COVID-19, seasonal influenza and Mycoplasma pneumoniae. Going forward, more innovative initiatives will be formulated and implemented to enhance hospital safety, patient services and sustainable development of HA.
