Progress Report on Strategic Priorities

Advice Sought

The HA Board is invited to note for information the progress of implementation of the strategic priorities of the Hospital Authority (HA) in the first quarter of 2022 (1Q22), as set out in this paper.

Background

- 2. At the HA Board (HAB) meeting held on 25 March 2021¹, Members approved the HA's service priorities for 2021-22 as set out in the HA Annual Plan for the year. To recap, the 2021-22 HA Annual Plan sets out the following five strategic goals with 17 strategies to guide the work of HA throughout the year:
 - (a) Improve service quality;
 - (b) Optimise demand management;
 - (c) Attract and retain staff;
 - (d) Enhance staff training and development; and
 - (e) Drive accountable and efficient use of financial resources.

Progress of Implementing the Strategic Priorities

3. The HA Annual Plan maps out 17 strategies with corresponding programme targets in 2021-22. Together with 73 programmes deferred from previous quarters, there were in total 372 individual programmes² planned for completion in 1Q22. As detailed in **Annex 1**, 249 of these programmes (67%) were achieved on schedule. 44 programmes (12%) were considered partially achieved as they had in principle fulfilled the original intent and / or achieved the major targets, including some service and training programmes impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The remaining 79 programmes (21%) were deferred mainly due to the COVID-19 pandemic, manpower availability, etc.

- 4. Hong Kong was enormously affected by the fifth wave of COVID-19 pandemic in the first few months of 2022. To cope with the upsurges in confirmed cases and corresponding demand for hospital services, rigorous measures were implemented to focus HA's resources in combatting the epidemic towards the strategic priority of minimising mortality and the management of critical and serious COVID-19 cases. They included augmentation of bed capacity to manage COVID-19 patients through mobilising first-tier and second-tier isolation beds, conversion of general wards, designation of hospitals and optimising the use of community treatment and isolation facilities through stratification of care, alongside with adjustment of elective services. Apart from in-patient services, manpower and resource deployment was also arranged to support the community through HA Community Geriatric Assessment Teams, Designated Clinics, holding centres for elderly, etc. Due to the severe epidemic situation and the impact on HA's services, implementation of the Annual Plan programmes has inevitably been affected.
- 5. A summary of the implementation progress of the deferred programmes is set out in **Annex 2**. Following the established mechanism for reporting to the Board, these deferred programmes will be further monitored till the revised completion date or until the target is achieved.

Way Forward

6. While the easing epidemic situation enabled the gradual resumption of HA's services in the past two months, HA will continue to closely monitor the evolving situation and suitably adjust its services in light of the latest development.
